# Teacher Intern Placement Program (TIPP)

# Department for Education, Children and Young People internships

- Are you passionate about public education in Tasmania?
- Would you like to begin your teaching career feeling confident, prepared and part of a team?
- Are you interested in securing a permanent position with the Department for Education, Children and Young People (DECYP)?

The Teacher Intern Placement Program (TIPP) is a unique opportunity to complete your final year of study whilst developing your practical teaching skills. As an Intern, you will be placed in a host school and partnered with a Mentor teacher who has time allocated to support your development.

As a TIPP Intern you will complete your UTAS studies online, enabling you to be on-site at your school 35 hours a week. You will be provided with a place to study and allocated up to 21 hours per week of dedicated study time. The remaining time will he spent working alongside your Mentor teacher.

By the end of the internship, you will have developed a working knowledge of school operations, gained practical classroom experience in a supported environment, and established professional relationships.

## What will I receive?

TIPP interns are provided with both financial and practical supports, these include:

- Minimum \$30,000 scholarship.
- Permanent employment with DECYP upon graduation and successful completion of your internship year.
- Access to mentor and colleague teachers for professional development.
- Use of a DECYP device, internet and access to the Department's software and network.
- Travel and accommodation support, if applicable.
- Limited Authority to Teach (LAT) in Terms 3 and 4 (the opportunity for paid employment at your host school, in addition to your scholarship).

# The selection process

To be considered for the TIPP you will first need to submit an Expression of Interest online <a href="here">here</a>. The recruitment process includes participation in an assessment centre. Successful applicants will then be offered an intern placement at an identified DECYP school. Up to 45 internships will be offered.

### Am I eligible?

Applications are open to UTAS Initial Teacher Education (ITE) students who are on track to graduate by the end of their internship year. TIPP internships are awarded based on the following criteria:

- Demonstrated aptitude for becoming a quality teacher.
- Academic performance.
- Successful completion of Professional Experience placements prior to final year placements.
- A maximum of four units per semester to complete in your final year of study.
- A demonstrated commitment to teaching in a Tasmanian Government school.
- Ongoing, unrestricted ability to work in Australia (working visas cannot be provided).
- LANTITE completed prior to Internship commencement.
